National Dog Day

Did you know that...

- National Dog Day is August 26, 2016 this year.
- National Dog Day celebrates all dogs, mixed breed and pure.
- National Dog Day was founded in 2004 by Colleen Paige.
- · 36.5 percent of households in the United States own dogs.
- For the 25th year in a row, the Labrador Retriever is the most popular dog in America followed by German Shepherds and Golden Retrievers.
- · Pitbulls and Labrador Retrievers are the vast majority of dogs found in shelters.
- About 37% of dogs are adopted from a shelter or rescue and 34% of dogs are purchased from a breeder. The rest are taken in as strays, purchased from a pet store.

How to Make an Animated GIF for Social Media Use

Tech Briefing by Jake Nonnemaker.

Animated GIFs are a great way to get your social media posts noticed. Here's a quick and easy way to make a fun GIF from any video clip you find on YouTube or other video service.

Step 1 – Select a Video

If you want to get a video from YouTube, Vimeo or other video service, you first need to find and copy the video URL link. Here's an example from YouTube: https:// www.youtube.com/watch?v=g-8CbXfKbZo).

Step 2 - Convert your Video to GIF

Now is a good time to note that Facebook only allows links to GIFs hosted at other sites like imgur.com which is free. With Twitter, you upload your GIF file just like a photo or video.

Go to http://imgur.com and create a free account (tip: you can use a social media account to login). Go to the New Post menu drop-down and select Video-to-GIF then paste the video URL link from step 1. Use the playback controls to select a shorter clip of the video by choosing the start and end times.

Use the controls to choose your clip.

When uploading GIFs to Twitter from a computer, there is a 5MB maximum file size which means that you will need to limit the video clip duration. Keep it 3 to 8 seconds.


Click "Create GIF" and at the next window,



you will need to do two things: mouse over the GIF image and click the download button to save it to your PC for Twitter. Click Copy to copy the URL link for posting on Facebook.

Step 3 - Post to social media

If posting to Twitter, create a Tweet as normal and click the option to upload a photo/video then select the GIF you downloaded in the previous step. Remember that there is a 5MB size limit so you may need to change the duration of your video clip in step 2 if it's too big.

If you are posting to Facebook, copy the link from Imgur and add ".gif' to the end of the link so it looks like: http://imgur.com/xcsenAd.gif. It must have the .gif extension at the end otherwise it will show up only as a link to the Imgur website and not an animated gif in the Facebook news feed.

Other Tips

If you have trouble getting the size of your GIF down to 5MB, you can use http://ezgif.com/optimize which will reduce the size by dropping frames or reducing the quality. Upload your large GIF or paste the URL link then select the optimization method. When you have the image to the size you need, download your optimized GIF then upload it to Imgur account.

Hootsuite requires a Pro or Enterprise account to upload animated GIF. And you will need to change your image uploads settings. For active links, read the article on the AXICOM website under the Blog tab.

Instead of your screen looking like a game of Mahjong, you can put the editing tools on one screen and leave the image on the other. With better visibility, you're less likely to commit errors and more likely to be finessed, and

you're not sacrificing valuable working time in the process.

Dogs at War

Dogs have participated in many of the wars since

America's inception including the Civil War, World War I, World War II, Vietnam and now in Iraq and Afghanistan. In the Iraq/Afghanistan wars, the dogs sniff out IEDs. In Vietnam, they were used to lead jungle patrols, saving numerous lives. In World War II, they sniffed out Japanese positions on Pacific Islands. In WWI, they acted as messengers. During the Civil War, they guarded soldiers.

Various breeds have been used during these conflicts. German

Shepherds, Labrador Retrievers and Belgian Malinois

have been especially good on battlefields. Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio, TX is the location for the Department of Defense Military Working Dogs Training School (DOD MWD). The Training School usually has about 1000 dogs in training for all branches of the military service. The SEALS had a Belgian Malinois with them during their raid on Osama Bin Laden in 2013.

At the end of service, dogs used to be discarded or even put down. After President Clinton passed "Robby's Law" in 2000, these dogs are now offered first to handlers or their families, then to law enforcement, then adoptive families. There are organizations now that help find homes for retired military dogs and usually there is a long waiting list of civilians who want to adopt them.

Teach Your Dog this New Tech Trick!

All you need is some sort of box (cigar box is good), an Arduino Youn, a webcam, and a big red button (Staples Easy button, for example).
