4 New Features of Microsoft Office 365

Microsoft Office 365 is gaining in popularity with businesses. Here are four more reasons why Office 365 holds such appeal.

Real-time collaboration in PowerPoint

Users will now be able to share a PowerPoint deck and update documents with others in real time. This means you'll be able to see edits as your colleagues make them. Microsoft was committed to expanding real-time coauthoring of a company's native applications, with Microsoft Word already rolling out this feature beforehand. Currently, real-time collaboration is available for PowerPoint on Windows desktops for Office 365 subscribers in the Office Insider program and for PowerPoint Mobile on Windows tablets.

Move attachments to the cloud and share with colleagues in Outlook

According to Kirk Koenigsbauer, corporate vice president for the Office team, this feature allows users to transform a traditional

document into a shared cloud document within Outlook. Previously, Outlook users could only attach cloud-based documents to an email, but this new feature makes it easier to send large files and to collaborate on those files with ease.

Users can upload files into their own OneDrive or a document library as part of an Office 365 group and then designate sharing permissions for the email recipients. The new feature is currently available in Outlook on the web as well as Outlook on Windows desktops for Office 365 subscribers.

Mobile notifications for changes to shared documents

With this new update, users will be notified when any cloud documents in Word, Excel and PowerPoint are being shared or edited. These notifications let you know when changes are being made, even if you are away from a particular document, so you're always connected and know when you have to act.

Writing outside the box

Customize your AutoCorrect

No matter how often or how much we write every day, there are still words, phrases and special characters that we can't seem to master. Increase your typing speed by personalizing AutoCorrect to fix your commonly misspelled words without prompting you. Most of these are preprogrammed into Word (pretty much any 'i' before 'e' mixup), but customizing your own settings can solve issues like accented letters that are missing from your keyboard, or replacing short abbreviations with verbose technical terms. Just go to the File menu, click on Options, select the Proofing tab and click on the AutoCorrect options to explore all of your options. to leave the app you're working in. At the moment, the Shared with Me tab is available on Windows desktops and Macs for all Office 365 subscribers, iOS and Android devices included. And soon, it will be available on Windows Mobile. And the "Recent Folders" tab -- used to help quickly locate files as well -- is now available in Word, Excel and PowerPoint on Windows desktops for Office 365 subscribers in the Office Insider program.

With the latest additions to Microsoft Office 365, small- and medium-sized businesses will enjoy enhanced staff collaboration, increased corporate productivity, and an overall competitive advantage.

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Apply document formatting to pasted text

No matter how original your content is, there will always be reasons to copy from an outside source and paste to your own. You may need a quote, a piece of data or just an outside voice to your writing. When using the copy and paste function, you may need to remove formatting carried over from the original source. Although the icons and interface of this feature have changed throughout different versions of Word, Microsoft has been careful to always leave it as an option for users. Simply adding the Windows key to your copy shortcut (Ctrl+Windows Key+V) will integrate the copied material into your content. Default paste options can be further customized in the Options menu.

Four Ways to Prevent Identity Theft

January is a great time to start the new year afresh and review what you would like to accomplish this coming year. As the goals of many people are financial in nature, keeping your financial data secure so that it is not stolen is an important corollary to that goal.

What is Identity Theft?

ID theft is a crime where a criminal uses your personal information to open credit cards or store credit accounts in your name. There are even cases where crooks have taken out mortgages and car loans using the personal information of unsuspecting victims. Trying to claw back your identity in these cases is extremely difficult and time consuming. First you need to gather any evidence and file a police report. Then you need to prove that you didn't open the credit account, mortgage or car loan because crooks will also open credit accounts then claim they are victims of ID theft to avoid paying. I cannot emphasize enough what a hassle you will encounter if this happens to you so go through these four steps to prevent it from happening to you!

1. Review Your Credit Reports

By federal law, everyone is entitled to a free copy of their credit report every year from each of the three credit bureaus: Experian, TransUnion and Equifax. A good strategy is to order one credit report from a different credit bureau every four months so you will never have to pay out of pocket. It costs no money and takes only about 15 minutes.

The only official website sanctioned by the Federal government to get your credit reports is https:// www.annualcreditreport.com. There are many other unofficial credit report websites but they will try to sell you other products such as identity theft protection or credit repair services.

There are several reasons that everyone should review their credit report several times each year. These include looking for markers of identity theft, review your credit card accounts, and look for erroneously reported information such as late payments which may harm your credit score.

2. Report Credit Report Errors

Credit reports often have erroneous information such as late payments, incorrect addresses or old contact information. If your credit report contain erroneous late payment information, contact the credit account issuer and request a correction. If your report has unrecognized addresses, this likely indicates that someone is opening credit in your name and rerouting the credit cards and statements. In this case, contact the police and credit issuer immediately. Make sure your mailing address and other contact information is current as you may have moved but the credit issuers may be sending correspondence to your previous address.

3. Use ID Theft Protection

A good way to protect yourself is to use a ID theft protection service which will alert you whenever a credit report is pulled in your name. This will give you a heads up that something is wrong if you didn't prompt such action yourself. If you belong to the American Automobile Club (AAA), they offer a free basic ID theft monitoring service. Or you can subscribe to a paid monitoring service such as LifeLock which has plans as low as \$10 per month. Both of the services are an affordable way to protect against ID theft.

4. Should You Close Dormant Credit Accounts?

Most of us have retail store credit or credit card accounts that you opened long ago and have forgotten. Perhaps they were opened to receive a special perk like airline miles or a discount from your store purchase. But financial experts, such as certified mortgage planning specialist Fred Gruber of the First Rate Financial Group, says that "closing these accounts can negatively impact you credit score." Leaving dormant credit accounts open will improve your FICO credit score which is important when it comes time to apply for a car loan, home mortgage or refinance a home loan. You will want a debt-to-credit limit ratio of 30% or less, so having a large amount of available untapped credit is advantageous. For example, if you have \$10,000 in debt, you will want to have at least \$30,000 in cumulative credit limit.

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
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


How Best to Fly a Kite!
