One-Note Will Revolutionize Your Note-Taking (Part 2) by Jake Nonnemaker

I covered the reasons why and how I use One-Note in the June newsletter and now I will share some of the benefits of using One-Note. Hopefully you've had a chance to try it!

One Note Benefits

Logical Organization: OneNote allows me to access all my different notes in one location and keep them neatly organized. I have notebooks for disparate parts of my life like customer

meetings, business prospects, staff tasks, cooking recipes, dinner menus, home remodel projects, kids chore log, future and past



Boy Scout camp outs, Boy Scout leader meeting notes, kids soccer schedule and responsibilities, gift ideas, list of books to read and movies to watch, Big Brothers Big Sisters board meetings and tasks, and church council meeting notes. Each notebook is divided into sections. And the sections contain pages which is where you add your notes, photos and links. OneNote has levels to organize notes, all of which are searchable.

Access notes on any device: I can now view my notes on any device from anywhere which is a tremendous convenience. For example, I may have taken meeting notes at a customer's office on my laptop PC but if I am in a staff meeting and want to recall some nugget of information, I can just pull it up on my iPhone instead of disrupting the flow and going out to get out my laptop PC. OneNote is available as a web app and for iOS, Android OS, Windows and MacOS.

Sharing notes: I can also send my notes via email or message to anyone. They don't have to even be using OneNote. If others are using OneNote, you can give them permission to edit your notes or see live changes that you make which makes your notes a living document. For example, I can share a project to-do list with my tech staff who can add or modify items on the list. Or I can create a shopping list which I can share with my spouse.

Note Flair: Traditional note taking is primarily textual in nature. But OneNote allows you to add entirely new types of content to your notes such as Internet articles, links to Office documents (i.e., Excel spreadsheets, Word Documents, PowerPoint slides, etc.), business cards, photos of whiteboards or PowerPoint presentations, digitally captured paper documents, photos and images, and digitally drawn sketches. OneNote will take the photo of a document, whiteboard or business card, digitize the text which make it searchable. It even works on handwritten text.



OneNote sections can be password protected which encrypts with 128-bit AES encryption. This is strong

encryption but less secure than 256-bit encryption which is considered military-grade. As long as you use a long password (e.g., the XKCD Comic method, it is strong enough to deter the vast majority of thieves and cyber crooks. Make sure to store your password in a safe place like a password manager; if you lose your password, you will not be able to access the section and Microsoft won't be able to help reset it.

If you store your OneNote notebooks in the cloud (i.e., OneDrive, Dropbox) so they are synchronized between devices, they will be safe as long as your cloud account uses a strong password and two-factor authentication.



New Design Upgrades to Office 365

Office 365 apps like PowerPoint, Word, Outlook, and Excel will be getting upgrades over the next few months. Microsoft expects these new features to boost productivity and overall efficiency of business users. Here's what they have planned.

Simplified ribbon

The biggest update is with the ribbon, which is a command bar at the top of a window. The new design now has a simpler, cleaner look that gives users the chance to customize the tools they work with most, simply by pinning apps or files to your Windows taskbar. Even though this new ribbon is designed with simplicity in mind, if you don't find it helpful you can still revert back to the regular three-line view.

Some users may already be using this new ribbon in the online version of Word, while Outlook for Windows will receive it sometime this month. However, Microsoft disclosed that they aren't yet ready to roll it out to PowerPoint, Word, and Excel for Windows.

Improved search option

One of the major changes is with the search option in Microsoft Office apps. The developers improved the search experience by using Microsoft graph, so users can now see search recommendations when they move their cursor to the search box. Some have already seen this update take effect, but it won't be available for Outlook on the web until August.

Better colors and icons

To make the overall design more aesthetically pleasing, the colors and icons of every app have been revamped, too. They wanted a more modern look crisp and clean no matter the size of the user's screen, which is why they employed scalable graphics. It first debuted on Word before appearing on Excel, PowerPoint, and Works for Windows last month. As for Outlook for Windows and Mac, users can expect the update later this summer.

Office 365 is constantly evolving to benefit subscribers. And to make things even more interesting, users will be chosen at random over the next several months to receive the updates, and Microsoft will gather their reviews to make further improvements. Co-creating new features with customers is something Microsoft truly believes in, so this isn't simply a social media tactic.

Watermelon, Feta and Mint Salad

What better to have on a summer picnic than a watermelon salad? If you haven't had one yet, now is the time! They are refreshing and easy to make!

Ingredients

- 3 pounds seedless watermelon (about 1 small or 1/4 large), rind removed, cut into 1-inch chunks (about 2 pounds/1kg chunks after rind is discarded)
- 1 tablespoon (15ml) juice from 1 lemon, plus 4 (2-inch) strips zest, removed with a sharp vegetable peeler
- 3 tablespoons (45ml) extra-virgin olive oil, plus more for drizzling

1/4 cup (10g) roughly chopped fresh mint leaves Up to 4 ounces (1 quart) arugula leaves (optional; see note) Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper 4 ounces (110g) feta cheese (see note)

Directions

- 1. Place watermelon chunks in a large bowl. Finely chop lemon zest. Add lemon juice and half of zest to bowl with watermelon. Add oil, mint, and arugula (if using) and toss until watermelon is evenly dressed. Season lightly to taste with salt and pepper. (The cheese will add saltiness, so go light on the salt at this stage.)
- 2. Transfer salad to a wide, shallow bowl or a large plate and spread out evenly. Crumble feta over the top. Sprinkle with remaining lemon zest. Drizzle with more olive oil and a few grinds of black pepper. Serve immediately.



Picnic Potato Salad

Ingredients

- 3 lbs russet potatoes, peeled and cubed into bite sized pieces
- 1½ cups mayonnaise
- 1 Tbsp. white vinegar
- 2 Tbsp. prepared yellow mustard
- 1 tsp. salt
- ½ tsp. freshly ground pepper
- 4 celery stalks, diced into small pieces
- 1 medium sweet onion, diced into small pieces
- 8 hard boiled eggs, chopped

Boil potatoes until fork tender. Strain and place into a large bowl. Set aside.

In a large measuring cup, measure your mayo, and stir in the vinegar, mustard, salt and pepper. Pour this mixture over the potatoes. Stir well.

Gently fold in the celery, onions, and eggs.

Cover and refrigerate until chilled. Enjoy!
